Background:

The Washburn Student Bar Association oversees all student organizations at Washburn University School of Law. WSBA has developed certain Bylaws, policies and procedures, and rules and regulations which supervises and guides student organizations. Once a student organization has fulfilled all requirements as provided in WSBA Bylaws, policies and procedures, and rules and regulations, that student organization is eligible for initial activation or reactivation to be recognized by and registered with the WSBA. Organizations who are registered with and recognized by the WSBA are eligible for allocated baseline funding by the WSBA. For fiscal year 2021-2022, all student organizations registered with and recognized by WSBA received baseline funding in the amount of \$500.00.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE WASHBURN STUDENT BAR ASSOCIATION

AN ACT

Section 1. The Washburn Student Bar Association shall hereby reactivate the Washburn Law Federalist Society, having properly requested such reactivation and having been certified as meeting all requirements of a WSBA Registered Student Organization.

Section 2. As an active and in good standing WSBA Registered Student Organization, the WSBA shall hereby allocate five hundred dollars (\$500.00) to the Washburn Law Federalist Society for the 2021-2022 fiscal year.

Section 3. Any WSBA law, policy, procedure, or rule, in whole or in part, in conflict with this Act shall be hereby repealed.

Section 4. This Act shall become effective immediately upon passage.
