The Washburn Student Bar Association (WSBA) supports Bar Revue as an annual social event and any expenses are the responsibility of WSBA. An Act to Approve and Appropriate Additional Funding for Bar Revue

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE WASHBURN STUDENT BAR ASSOCIATION

AN ACT

Section 1. The Washburn Student Bar Association shall hereby allocate three thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500) from WSBA funds for Bar Revue. This allocation shall be exclusively used for food, entertainment, and special event liability insurance, including applicable and expectable fees and taxes.

Section 2. The 2021-2022 Co-Chairs of Bar Revue shall be approved and empowered to make expenditures, in conformity with Section 1, to accomplish the purposes of this Act.

Section 4. Any WSBA law, policy, procedure, rule, or regulation, in whole or in part, in conflict with this Act shall be hereby repealed.

Section 5. This Act shall become effective immediately upon passage.
