AN ACT

Section 1. The Washburn Student Bar Association (WSBA) shall hereby approve the following individual who was nominated by the WSBA President for the open position for the remainder of the respective position's expected term:

a) Taylor Thompson, Representative-At-Large

Section 2. The term of office for each individual nominated and confirmed, pursuant to Section 1 of this Act, shall hereby commence immediately upon passage of this Act.

Section 3. Any WSBA law, policy, procedure, rule, or regulation, in whole or in part, in conflict with this Act shall be hereby repealed.

Section 4. This Act shall become effective immediately upon passage.
